The Washington, D.C. Chapter of the Copyright Society of the U.S.A. is excited to invite chapter members to a LUNCHEON PROGRAM – *It's Not Just For Cyberpunks: Real-World Considerations at the Intersection of Copyright and Virtual Reality*.

This program will aim to identify and explain some of the operational nuts and bolts behind the online, "virtual worlds" phenomenon, and to focus on practical copyright issues that businesses engaging with such worlds may encounter. We will explore from various angles the opportunities and pitfalls that await companies in the still-evolving (and largely untested) legal landscape of virtual environments such as Second Life and World of Warcraft. Hypotheticals will help to crystallize some of the key issues and elicit discussion among the presenters and audience.

Among the topics the program will cover are:

- What, precisely, is copyrightable in a virtual world, and who owns the copyright?
- Can infringement occur in virtual worlds, and in what ways?
- How does "real world" fair use analysis translate into a virtual world setting?
- How do the formalities of copyright notice, publication, and registration apply to copyrighted content in virtual worlds?
- What are best practices for protecting and exploiting copyrighted content and related interests in the virtual environments?
