David Nimmer is of counsel to Irell & Manella LLP in Los Angeles, California. He also served as a visiting Professor at University of California, Los Angeles Law School and Distinguished Scholar at the Berkeley Center for Law and Technology. In 2000, he was elected to the American Law Institute.

Prof. Nimmer was selected for inclusion in Southern California "Super Lawyers" by *Los Angeles Magazine* in 2006, 2007 and 2008. Also, he has been named in *The Best Lawyers in America* for over 10 years. The *Los Angeles and San Francisco Daily Journal* named Mr. Nimmer one of California's "Top 10 Copyright Lawyers" in 2008.

Professor Nimmer represents clients in the entertainment, publishing, and high-technology fields. He gave congressional testimony on behalf of the United States Telephone Association in 1997 and the National Association of Broadcasters in 1992, and Parliamentary testimony on behalf of the Combined Newspaper and Magazine Copyright Committee of Australia in Sydney in 1993.

He received an A.B. with distinction and honors in 1977 from Stanford University and his J.D. in 1980 from Yale Law School, where he served as editor of the *Yale Law Journal*.

Professor Nimmer also served as the Chairman on the Committee on Intellectual Properties Litigation for the American Bar Association from 1989–1992.
