DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO GARVEY SCHUBERT BARER

Garvey Schubert Barer is located on the southwest corner of the intersection of Second Avenue and Seneca Street in downtown Seattle.

Interstate 5 from North of Seattle

- Exit at Union Street.
- Take Union to Second Avenue.
- Turn left onto Second Avenue.
- Drive south two blocks to Seneca Street.
- To enter the parking garage turn right onto Seneca Street. Seneca is a two-way street only between Second and First Avenues. Make the first left turn into the parking garage.

Driving West on State Route 520

- Take Interstate 5 heading south and follow the directions above.

Interstate 5 from South of Seattle (for example, from Seattle-Tacoma airport)

- Take the Seneca Street exit and follow Seneca down the hill (west) to Second Avenue.
- To enter the parking garage cross Second Avenue. Seneca is a two-way street only between Second and First Avenues. Make the first left turn into the parking garage.

Driving West on Interstate 90

- Get on Interstate 5 heading north.
- Take the Madison Street exit.
- Turn left (west) on Madison Street.
- Drive down the hill to First Avenue.
- Turn right (north) on First Avenue and drive two blocks north to Seneca Street.
- Turn right (east) on Seneca Street.
- To enter the parking garage drive two-thirds of the way up the block and enter the second garage entrance.

Driving from West Seattle

- Take the exit for Highway 99 North on the West Seattle bridge.
- Exit Highway 99 at the Seneca Street exit and cross First Avenue.
- To enter the parking garage drive two-thirds of the way up the block and enter the second garage entrance.

SPEAKERS

PROFESSOR HEIDI BOND. Professor Bond grew up in Southern California. She earned a B.S. in Chemistry and Pure Mathematics from Florida State University, and a M.S. in Physical Chemistry from the University of California, Berkeley. She received a National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship from 2000-2003 and twice was awarded the department teaching award. She graduated from the University of Michigan School of Law, where she was the Executive Articles Editor for the Michigan Law Review, and was awarded the Henry M. Bates Memorial Scholarship Award, the law school's highest honor. She clerked for Judge Alex Kozinski of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals and for Associate Justice Sandra Day O'Connor (Retired) and Associate Justice Anthony M. Kennedy of the United States Supreme Court. Professor Bond joined the faculty in 2009.

Her research focuses on the interaction between contract and intellectual property law, particularly as it relates to the use of free and open source licensing. Her teaching interests include contracts, patent law, copyright, and trademark law.

CLAIRE KEELEY. Claire Keeley is Senior Corporate Counsel at Corbis Corporation, a privately-held image and IP rights licensing company owned by Bill Gates. Claire manages all litigation in the Americas and runs Corbis' Global IP Enforcement Team. She also runs the Personality Rights Enforcement Program for Corbis' GreenLight brand. Prior to joining Corbis, Claire practiced at Lane Powell in Seattle and Thelen Reid & Priest in Silicon Valley.

BRIAN ROWE. Brian Rowe is the founder of Freedom for IP, a volunteer organization focusing on the intersection of human rights and intellectual property. He interned at Creative Commons in 2008, working on public domain and noncommercial use in copyright, and spent last summer in Washington D.C. on a Google Public Policy Fellowship, working at Public Knowledge on copyright and FCC issues. Brian serves on the Washington State Access to Justice Board's Technology Committee, and is an alumnus of Students for Free Culture. For the last two years Brian has been working with the Future of the Law Institute to teach high school students about fair use of music and bloggers' rights through a mock trial held at University of Washington's Law School. Brian also helped plan the Seattle Law of the Commons Seminar.

Brian has a background in information technology. He holds a B.S. in Informatics and B.A. in Political Science, both from University of Washington, and a J.D. from Seattle University. Brian will be teaching a class on Policy, Law, and Ethics in Information Management this Winter at the University of Washington's Information School.
